









## Key Features

- Highly digestible
- Easy to establish
- All energy of plant is contained in the leaves
- Good biomass production, best results when fed with other forages

## Seeding

Mono Seeding Rate	4-6 lbs./acre
Mix Seeding Rate	2-3 lbs./acre
Broadcast Seeding Rate	5-6 lbs./acre
Best time to Plant	July-Sept
Seeding Depth (in./with drill)	1/4 in

## Considerations

- Brassica crops can cause animal health disorders if not grazed properly.
- Introduce grazing animals to brassica pastures slowly (usually over 3-5 days).
- Keep brassicas to under 1/3 of the grazing animals diet
- Always supplement brassicas with dry hay or other grasses (higher in fibre).
